"Whole Lotta Love" by Led Zeppelin: "No matter how many times I hear this song, I'm still in awe of Robert Plant's voice. This song is a classic party song. The opening chord gets my adrenaline pumping."

"Shot at the Night" by The Killers: "I've always been a big fan of theirs, and I love the throwback vibe of this song. It's got almost an '80s pop-rock feel. All the intricacies and different layers to the track make it really interesting too."

"I'm on Fire" by Bruce Springsteen: "It's hard to pick a favorite Springsteen track, but this one ranks pretty high. Such a simple song on the surface, but the lyrics are so powerful and honest. I've heard it thousands of times, but it still hits me like a ton of bricks."

"Tupelo Honey" by Van Morrison: "This song is all-out devotion. It triggers the awareness of your surroundings and really makes you appreciate the company you keep."

"Two" by Ryan Adams: "I've been a fan of Ryan Adams for the longest time. I respect him as a true songwriter, but also that he's not afraid to take risks throughout his career."
