FANS READY FOR ZAC BROWN BAND'S FESTIVAL-CLOSING SET AT 2019 FASTER HORSES



BROOKLYN, MI -- The some-40,000 fans in attendance at the Faster Horses Festival are reared up and ready for action on the final day Sunday, July 21 at Michigan International Speedway. After weather delayed the three final main stage acts by about three hours Saturday, fans are praying that Mother Nature leaves the third weekend in July in the Irish Hills alone for a change. The Zac Brown Band is set to play the festival out at 9:25 p.m. following headlining performances from Toby Keith on Saturday and Keith Urban on Friday.

Since the weather report is an inescapable aspect of an outdoor music festival, we're looking at a chance of showers, the potential for an evening thunderstorm amidst much cooler temperatures. The National Weather Service is giving Brooklyn a 40 percent of showers and thunderstorms Sunday afternoon and evening. This comes with a projected high-temperature of 81 degrees with a wind from the northeast between 6 and 8 mph.

"Thunderstorms with heavy rain could cause localized flooding," the NWS writes in a hazardous weather outlook for Jackson County (and several others).

The Zac Brown Band will follow Cassadee Pope, Michael Ray, Dylan Scott, Kip Moore and Brothers Osborne on the main stage. Over at the Next from Nashville stage, Caylee Hammack, Seaforth, Kassi Ashton and Hardy are set to close things down over there.
